Ready for teacher-directed instruction

Green Light

- Immediate

Ready to begin

Teacher-directed learning

Where/when can you use your device?

- Before school
- During class exchanges
- During lunch
- After school
- Upon entering class, take your phone out and place it face down on your desk (upper right-hand corner)
- You must practice self-control and not touch it unless instructed to do so by the teacher (red, yellow, or green light)

What can you NOT do?

- You CANNOT use your device in:
 - Restrooms
 - Locker rooms
 - In classrooms if a teacher says you are not using devices
 - You CANNOT USE EAR BUDS/AIR PODS /BEATS ETC during the school day, (before school and after school = yes) This is a safety issue.
 - You CANNOT use it for inappropriate behavior (videos, pictures, posts, etc)

Consequences:

- If you break rules regarding cell phones/ear buds/electronic devices etc, you will receive consequences
- If you refuse to give your cell phone to an adult that asks you, that is an automatic suspension
- You may lose your electronic device privilege as an individual, class or as an entire school by not following the rules
- Ultimately you determine the success of this program
