



LDOE Coordinated Enrollment Expectations

Should ensure that every family who submits an application through the coordinated enrollment system will be considered equitably.

What does it mean?

- A coordinated enrollment system focused on equity:
- o Levels the playing field by improving access to quality early learning
- CANNOT rely upon a "first-come, first-served" method
- Ongoing process with a main enrollment timeframe (even if registration is on-going)
- Clear process for responding to questions, complaints and appeals regarding enrollment system
