In the coming months, CPSB may experience some uncertainty in cash flow needs at any given time caused by costly expenditure progress payments related to Hurricane Laura for various items such as restoration services, roof protection and repairs, and other necessary spending needed to get CPSB schools operational. A special accounting fund has been created to track all revenues from insurance proceeds, FEMA claim reimbursements and any other revenues along with all hurricane related expenditures.

Cash shortages may be unavoidable due to the differences in the timing of expenditures and the ability to request reimbursement from FEMA after insurance proceeds are exhausted. Total damages will far exceed total insurance proceeds.

Staff is requesting authorization to utilize short term interfund loans when necessary to facilitate cash flow while navigating through this time period. As insurance proceeds and FEMA reimbursements are received the interfund loans will be repaid. It's not possible to predict at the current time when this may occur nor how much will be needed.

Staff recommendation: Staff is recommending granting authorization to the Superintendent to approve short term interfund loans as needed to facilitate cash flow needs caused by Hurricane Laura recovery.

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF CALCASIEU PARISH SCHOOL BOARD, STATE OF LOUISIANA ("BOARD") TO PROCEED WITH A FINANCING IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED MILLION AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$100,000,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING **DAMAGE** DEMOLITION, REPAIR, RECONSTRUCTION. RENOVATION. RESTORATION **AND IMPROVEMENT** SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES PREVIOUSLY CAUSED BY HURRICANES LAURA AND DELTA, INCLUDING ALL FURNISHINGS, FIXTURES AND FACILITIES INCIDENTAL OR NECESSARY IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; EMPLOYING BOND COUNSEL AND OTHER PROFESSIONALS; AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE FORM AND EXECUTION OF THE BOND AGREEMENT PURCHASE IN CONNECTION WITH ISSUANCE, SALE **AND DELIVERY** OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION TO THE LOUISIANA LOCAL **GOVERNMENT** ENVIRONMENTAL **FACILITIES** AND COMMUNITY **DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY** LOUISIANA STATE BOND COMMISSION; PAYING COSTS OF ISSUANCE OF THE DEBT, AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS WITH RESPECT THERETO.

WHEREAS, as a direct result of unprecedented damage and destruction visited and inflicted upon the Parish of Calcasieu, State of Louisiana by Hurricanes Laura and Delta, seventy-five (75) of the seventy-five (75) public school facilities (the "Facilities") of the Calcasieu Parish School Board (the "Board") sustained damage, to varying degrees, the Board must borrow funds for the purpose of financing damage demolition, repair, reconstruction, renovation, restoration and improvement of its Facilities, in an amount not to exceed ONE HUNDRED MILLION AND NO/100 (\$100,000,000) DOLLARS (the "Project");

WHEREAS, it is presently estimated the actual costs of damage demolition, repair, reconstruction, renovation, restoration and improvement of school Facilities owned and operated by the Board may total or exceed TWO HUNDRED FIFTY MILLION AND NO/100 (\$250,000,000) DOLLARS;

WHEREAS, it is presently anticipated the proceeds of insurance policies maintained by the Board for its Facilities will total FORTY MILLION AND NO/100 (\$40,000,000) DOLLARS;

WHEREAS, the Board has previously become a participating political subdivision and

member of the Louisiana Local Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority (the "Authority"), which is a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana (the "State") established for public purposes pursuant to Chapter 10-D of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1050, as amended (La. R.S. 33:4548.1 through 4548.16, inclusive) (the "Authority Act");

WHEREAS, in order to finance projects by the State's political subdivisions of public infrastructure and public works of all types, the Authority is authorized to issue bonds and notes and loan the proceeds thereof to political subdivisions who become members of the Authority for such purposes, under the authority of the Authority Act, and other constitutional and statutory authority;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to proceed with a financing through the Authority in an amount of not to exceed ONE HUNDRED MILLION AND NO/100 (\$100,000,000) DOLLARS in order to fund the costs of the Project, in a manner and structure to be determined by subsequent resolution or ordinance;

WHEREAS, it is the expectation of the Board that significant portions of the costs of the Project will be funded through a grant/reimbursement process through the United States Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA"), but the FEMA grant/reimbursement process is known to be both lengthy and requiring prior expenditure of the Board's funds prior to application for reimbursement;

WHEREAS, it is also the expectation of the Board that a portion of the costs of the Project will be funded through Community Development Block Grants as well as donations and miscellaneous grants;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to authorize filing of an application with the Authority requesting that the Authority grant approval for issuance of revenue bonds to be issued on behalf of the Board (the "Bonds"), issuance of which are expressly authorized by the provisions of Subpart A of Part II, Chapter 4 of Subtitle II of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (La. R.S. 39:501, et seq., and 524, et seq.) (the "Act") and in accordance with the Authority Act;

WHEREAS, United States Treasury Regulations (the "Regulations") require that an issuer of tax exempt bonds evidence "official intent" towards issuance of the Bonds within the meaning of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (the "Code") and the Regulations promulgated thereunder before reimbursing the Board for any prior or subsequent expenditures in connection with the

Project from the proceeds of the Bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Code and Regulations promulgated thereunder for such reimbursement to be deemed an expenditure of Bond proceeds,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Calcasieu Parish School Board, State of Louisiana, as follows:

SECTION 1. The statements of fact expressly contained within the preamble to this Resolution have been specifically reviewed by the members of the Board and are found to be factually true and correct and are made resolutions of the Board.

SECTION 2. The Board is authorized to proceed with a financing through the Authority in an amount not to exceed ONE HUNDRED MILLION AND NO/100 (\$100,000,000) DOLLARS, to be represented by the Authority's Bonds to provide funds to finance the Project. The Authority's Bonds authorized herein may be issued in a single or multiple series on a taxable and/or tax-exempt basis, to mature not later than twenty (20) years from their date of issuance, and bear interest at a fixed or variable rate or rates not to exceed five (5%) percent per annum.

The proceeds of the Bonds will be loaned by the Authority to the Board pursuant to a loan or other financing agreement (the "Loan Agreement"). The Board will make payments under the Loan Agreement from its receipt of lawfully available funds, including, but not limited to, its insurance proceeds, grant funds received from FEMA, and other funds available to the Board for such purposes, including Community Development Block Grants as well as donations and miscellaneous grants (collectively, "Lawfully Available Funds").

A certified copy of this Resolution and such other documents and certificates, as may be required by the Authority, shall be submitted to the Authority, for issuance of the Bonds under the provisions of the Act and the Authority Act.

SECTION 3. The structure, terms and conditions of any such borrowing by the Board shall be determined by subsequent resolution or ordinance of the Board, provided, however, that the term of said borrowing shall not exceed twenty (20) years from the date of each issuance of Bonds which shall bear interest at a fixed or variable rate or rates of interest not to exceed five (5%) percent per annum, to be issued in one or more series, and shall be secured by and payable solely from Lawfully Available Funds.

SECTION 4. Prior to issuance of the Bonds, the Board anticipates that it may pay a portion of the costs of the Project from other available funds, including insurance proceeds. Upon

issuance of the Bonds, the Board reasonably expects to reimburse said expenditures from the proceeds of the Bonds. Any such allocation of the proceeds of the Bonds for reimbursement will be made with respect to the capital expenditures (as defined in Treasury Regulation 1.150-1 (h) and will be made upon the delivery of the Bonds and not later than eighteen (18) months after the date of (i) the date such expenditure was made or (ii) the date improvements were placed in service. This resolution is intended to be a declaration of intent to reimburse in accordance with the provisions of the Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.

SECTION 5. The Board hereby finds and determines that a real necessity exists for employment of special bond counsel in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, and accordingly Joseph A. Delafield, A Professional Corporation ("Bond Counsel") of Lake Charles, Louisiana, is hereby employed (such employment to be by the Authority) to do and perform comprehensive legal and coordinate professional work with respect to the issuance of the Bonds. Said Bond Counsel shall prepare and submit to such officials of the Board and the Authority for adoption all proceedings incidental to, and shall counsel and advise the Board and the Authority on issuance and sale of, the Bonds by the Authority. The fee of Bond Counsel is contingent upon issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds, and shall be in accordance with the Attorney General's then current Bond Counsel Fee Schedule and other guidelines, as negotiated, for comprehensive legal and coordinate professional work in the issuance of revenue bonds applied to the actual aggregate principal amount issued, sold, delivered and paid for at the time such Bonds are delivered, together with reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses incurred and advanced in connection with issuance of the Bonds, said fee to be subject to the Attorney General's written approval of said employment and fee to be paid with Bonds proceeds.

SECTION 6. The Board hereby authorizes and directs its Superintendent and Ex-Officio Secretary, and such other officials of the Board to do any and all things necessary and incidental to carry out the provisions of this resolution.

SECTION 7. Upon sale of the Bonds, the Superintendent and other officials of the Board, as Executive Officers, are each authorized, empowered and directed to execute on behalf of the Board, the Bond Purchase Agreement, by and between the Authority, the Board and the Placement Agent (as hereinafter defined), the Loan Agreement and any other certificates, documents or instruments in such form as may be approved by Bond Counsel to the Board. The Superintendent, and other officials of the Board, be and they are further authorized, empowered, and directed to execute on behalf of the Board, at or about the time of execution of the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Loan Agreement and any other certificates, documents or instruments deemed necessary by Bond Counsel to the Board, in order to

effectuate issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds.

SECTION 8. If any provision or item of this resolution or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications of this resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items or applications, and to this end, the provisions of this resolution are hereby declared to be severable.

SECTION 9. The selection of Government Consultants, Inc., as municipal advisor (the "Municipal Advisor") in connection with issuance and sale of the Bonds, is hereby approved and authorized. The compensation of the Municipal Advisor shall be payable from proceeds of the Bonds and shall be subject to the approval of the Board and the Louisiana State Bond Commission.

SECTION 10. By virtue of the Board's application for, acceptance and utilization of the benefits of the Louisiana State Bond Commission's approval(s) resolved and set forth herein, it resolves that it understands and agrees that such approval(s) are expressly conditioned upon, and it further resolves that it understands, agrees and binds itself, its successors and assigns to, full and continuing compliance with the "State Bond Commission Policy on Approval of Proposed Use of Swaps, or other forms of Derivative Products Hedges, Etc.," adopted by the Commission on July 20, 2006, as to the borrowing(s) and other matter(s) subject to the approval(s), including subsequent application and approval under said Policy of the implementation or use of any swap(s) or other product(s) or enhancement(s) covered thereby.

Stifel, Nicolaus & Company, Incorporated, Baton Rouge, Louisiana (the "Underwriter" or "Placement Agent"), is hereby employed as the Underwriter and/or Placement Agent to effect a sale of the Bonds or a direct placement of the Bonds, compensation to be subsequently approved by the Board and to be paid from proceeds of the Bonds and contingent upon issuance of the Bonds; provided, no compensation shall be due to the Placement Agent unless the Bonds are issued and delivered and all costs must be reasonable and approved by the Board and the Authority.

SECTION 12. The Board shall incur no financial liability for issuance of the Bonds, other than the non-refundable application fee with the Louisiana State Bond Commission, until such time as issuance of the Bonds has been approved by the Louisiana State Bond Commission and a Bonds resolution or ordinance has been duly approved and adopted by the Board.

SECTION 13. A copy of this Resolution shall be published immediately after its

adoption in one (1) issue of the Board's official journal. For a period of thirty (30) days from the date of such publication, any person in interest shall have the right to contest the legality of this Resolution and of the Bonds to be issued pursuant hereto and the provisions hereof securing the Bonds. After the expiration of said thirty (30) days, no one shall have any right to contest the validity of the Bonds or the provisions of this Resolution, and the Bonds shall be conclusively presumed to be legal and no court shall thereafter have the authority to inquire into such matters.

SECTION 14. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Purpose: The Head Start Program provides an integrated approach of early childhood care and education that includes comprehensive services to seventy-four (74) children ages 3 and 4. It is designed to focus on providing early literacy and mathematical skills necessary for children to become kindergarten ready. The program promotes school readiness by enhancing social and cognitive development of children by providing health, nutritional, social and other services. CPSB School Readiness Goals are aligned with the Head Start Childhood Development and Early Learning Framework and the Louisiana Birth to 5 Early Learning and Development Standards. Research-based assessment methods are being used to support teacher-child interactions and children's progress towards the school readiness goals. Head Start program also includes engaging parents, families and communities in their child's learning.

Subject: Return to 5 Days for Grades 7-12

CPSB had well designed plans to start school on August 24th when Hurricane Laura arrived, causing a delay in those plans. Hurricane Delta made landfall on Friday, October 9, further delaying the start of school for most CPSB schools.

As schools have opened, our 7th-12th grade schools have operated under the original alternating day schedule, with some students attending on Monday/Wednesday and others attending on Tuesday/Thursday to create smaller class sizes for COVID purposes. Many stakeholders have requested a return to a regular 5 days per week schedule. The State is now in Phase 3 of COVID protocol, which allows groups of 50 socially distanced to the maximum extent possible and 75% rider capacity on buses. Masks are still a requirement for all grades 3-12. Our state liaison provided a survey of responding districts on October 30th showing many of them returning to 5 days per week.

Staff has processed information on the quarantine (positive test or direct contact) of 182 employees and 324 students since Hurricane Delta, which certainly provides challenges. The state rules and regulations are clear on the processes and the coordination with the Louisiana Department of Health. Just like all other school districts, we understand that COVID issues will continue to be an issue in our system no matter our schedule.

Staff is recommending a return to 5 days per week for grades 7-12 effective on Monday, November 30th, upon return from the Thanksgiving holidays.

RE: Revised Calendar for the 2020-2021 School Year

Date: November 2, 2020

As you are all aware, our school system has faced unprecedented challenges since March 13, 2020. The Covid-19 measures for school districts were challenging enough as we approached the 2020-2021 school year. Modifications to the district calendar and significant protocols were implemented to address Covid-19. Unfortunately, the adjusted first day of school, August 24, never materialized. The compounding effects of Hurricane Laura and Hurricane Delta have created many hurdles in addressing student learning.

Staff has worked to address the potential *learning loss* associated with Covid-19 and the hurricanes. Of importance was, again, to modify the district calendar for the remainder of the school year. A calendar committee was organized with the objective of maximizing instructional minutes by considering the many parameters involved so that we provide our students with the best possible calendar-scenario for student learning needs.

The committee tackled two major dynamics: 1. How many instructional minutes to add, and 2. In doing so, what limitations were present that could potentially minimize the amount. Limitations included EOC testing and remediation dates in June, graduation dates, summer school start and completion dates, and *new* gain or remediation efforts to be implemented in the early summer.

The committee of twenty-seven teachers, principals, assistant principals, directors, supervisors, and other staff discussed both objectives in two Zoom meetings. After each meeting, a survey was sent to members, requesting feedback. The committee responded to items discussed with the following recommendations:

- An additional thirty minutes be added to the instructional day starting November 30th, 2020
 - o Approximately fifteen minutes in the a.m. and fifteen minutes in the p.m.
- The school year be extended to June 2, 2021 for students and June 3, 2021 for teachers
- Converting the holidays of February 17, April 7, 8, and 9 to instructional days
- Removing the January 11th teacher in-service day

Staff is recommending that the aforementioned recommendations be adopted for the 2020-2021 District Calendar.
