The K-5 ELA Resource Review Committee has reviewed the English Language Arts materials which were tiered by the state according to the Publishers' Criteria for the Common Core State Standards in ELA and is pleased to recommend the adoption of HMH Journeys with all of its resources.

The committee voted 0 for Pearson Reading Street, 13 for HMH Journeys, and 5 for the Louisiana Believes ELA Guidebook / Core Knowledge Language Arts. While no resource is perfectly adapted to all the content and practices of the Common Core State Standards; the majority of the committee members feel that the resources made available through HMH Journeys will aid the teachers in enhancing their designs of Common Core lesson plans and provide opportunities for rigorous ELA instruction.

Implementation of the Common Core State Standards in ELA has caused shifts in the instruction found in our language arts classrooms. The use of complex texts, reading, writing and speaking grounded in evidence and the building of knowledge through content rich non-fiction have become a focus in ELA classrooms. Additionally, there are changes that must occur in instruction. Across the district we are making strides in transitioning to Common Core, but the transition is not a simple one. Some of us are further along than others in our study of how our teaching must change to meet the CCSS-ELA.
